

Incident Overview

Carpenter 1 Fire Summary for July 7, 2013 (at 6:00pm)

Start Date: July 1, 2013

Mandatory evacuations are in effect for the Trout Canyon community. Kyle Canyon and Lee Canyon are under evacuation.

Number of residents evacuated: 520

Red Cross Evacuation Shelters have been set up at two locations:

- Pahrump, NV at the Hafen Elementary in Pahrump, NV at 7120 S. Hafen Ranch Rd., Pahrump NV 89061
- Las Vegas at the James Bilbray Elementary at 9370 Brent Ln, Las Vegas, NV 89143

Assistance is available 24 hours a day. Local governmental partners are making animal sheltering available for animals and pets of all types.

Red Cross also delivering food and water to residents gathering at the perimeter of the evacuation areas.

Road Closures:

- Lee Canyon Rd. (State Route 156) is closed at U.S. 95.
 - Kyle Canyon Rd (State Route 57) is closed at U.S. Route 95.
 - Trout Canyon Rd. is closed at State Route 160.
 - Lovell Canyon Rd. is closed at Trout Canyon Rd.
- Escorts available after 8:00 a.m.

TFR: Temporary flight restrictions are in effect over the fire area.

FIRE RESTRICTIONS: Stage 1 Fire Restrictions are in effect.

- Open campfires charcoal grills and stove fires are prohibited except in developed camp and picnic areas. Stoves fueled solely by petroleum or LPG fuels are acceptable.
- Smoking is restricted to enclosed buildings, within vehicles equipped with ashtrays, and on paved or surfaced roads, within developed recreation sites or while stopped in an area at least three-feet in diameter that is barren or cleared of all flammable material.
- Welding or operating an acetylene or other torch with open flame are prohibited.

Nevada Governor Brian Sandoval toured the fire area and the incident command post in Pahrump on

No structures have been lost. No injuries have occurred on the fire.

Fire control objectives include protection of the Trout, Lee and Kyle communities.

There are 18 crews on scene, 8 of which are Type 1 Hotshot crews, the most highly trained. The Hotshot crews we have are the same type as the crew recently lost in Arizona.

There are the following air assets on the fire:

7 helicopters

4 heavy air tankers

39 engines

10 water tenders

18 hot shot crews

VLAT (Very Large Air Tanker. Based on a DC-10). It can drop 11,700 gallons per load.

Fire is located in some very rugged and in inaccessible areas. Engines and other motorized vehicles have limited access.
